Executive Director's Report - May 2026

Claire Eagle

Administration

- The annual workers' comp audit has been completed and submitted.
- We did not receive the Consulting Services Grant from the CFGL for the website redesign. Thankfully, the pre-approval of the Board to use the \$25,000 that was transferred into the maintenance reserve fund if we didn't get this grant is still allowing us to move forward with the website. Brooke and I have already met with Hustlefish and worked the original quote down \$4,000 to a total of \$21,000 and \$50/month hosting cost. We have our kickoff meeting scheduled for later this week to begin work!

Facilities

- Unfortunately, we are still working through our property insurance renewal. Cincinnati really drug their feet in getting our agent of record switched over. So, while our new agent Eric was able to work on quotes from new providers, he was unable to do any negotiating with Cincinnati. At this time, we have automatically renewed our policies as is. As soon as he is officially on record as our agent with Cincinnati Insurance he will be renegotiating.

Grants, Sponsorships and Donations

- The second phase of the Impact Grant was submitted by May 8th. There is no current known timeline on when we might be informed if we got it or if there will be a third phase in the application process.
- We've received \$5,000 in support from the McAllister Foundation for Feast School Days.
- The Annual Campaign is being worked on with the hope that letters are mailed out in mid-June.
- Mitchell and I are working on a grant application to the Lafayette Life Foundation to support the new homeschool programming launch this fall as well as the revamp of our travelling trunk program.

Battlefield Museum Report – May 2026

- Visitor numbers are up
- Bathrooms are not ahead of schedule, but neither are they yet behind. It's looking good.
- Square register replaced and running well.

The numbers are still looking pretty good. Since the 21st of last month, we've had 650 guests, and that's with almost an entire week missing due to the early date of this meeting. Last month at the same time we had 702 visitors, but we're getting, on average, a few more people per day this month. I expect that by the 20th, this month will be at least on par with April.

At long last, the new bathrooms are open. They're very nice! I assume you'll all be coming out to see them. *We have motion-activated lighting!*

Shipments are arriving for Feast, and the process of keeping things orderly as new boxes keep arriving has begun.

Research Library Report – May 2026

Research requests and library visits have been a little slow these past few weeks, though many researchers have reached out to ask about our resources and the digital indexes on our website. We've also had a few visitors come in to ask about the library and TCHA in general.

Library volunteers continue to work on various projects, including working on Children's Home cards, marriage records, family/surname cards, and Poor Farm records.

As a reminder, the cemetery tour at the Indiana Veterans' Home will be taking place on Saturday May 30th from 2-4pm. Staff and volunteers are continuing to conduct research on their chosen Civil War veterans. I've had a couple of our volunteers reach out for assistance. If you can, please come out to support!

Research Library Stats:

- This past month we've assisted a total of 16 researchers, 10 email/mail/phone calls and 6 in-person visits
 - 2 out of the 6 in-person visits were TCHA members
 - Research topics include marriage records, probate records, history of smaller towns in the county, and land and property histories.

The research library continues to be busy! Just like last month, we've had more in-person visits than remote research requests. We've also had a handful of visitors come in asking general questions about the library and our genealogy resources.

Planning the cemetery tour at the Indiana Veterans' Home is going great! Volunteers have started researching their chosen veteran and are very excited to present their findings. As a reminder, it will take place on Saturday May 30th from 2-4pm. Please spread the word!

Feast of the Hunters' Moon Report - May 2026

Over the past month, I have been working diligently to continue securing service providers and finalizing operational logistics for the 2026 Feast of the Hunters' Moon. As part of this process, we have transitioned several vendors in an effort to improve both pricing and overall service quality. Most notably, we are moving away with Home City Ice and working with a new vendor from Delphi, Arctic Owl Ice. We are also in the final stages of discussions focused on our heavy equipment rental agreement, as well as table and chair rental services for the Feast grounds. More on that once details are solidified.

I have been working with Mitchell as he prepares and organizes program contracts for 2026 participants. We have now communicated with all artists who we invited to return this year, and many have already responded, confirming their interest in participating once again. Additionally, Mitchell has spent considerable time revising and updating the Feast contract language to better reflect TCHA's operational needs. These revisions modernize portions of the agreement and provide additional flexibility should circumstances arise requiring TCHA to terminate or modify an agreement between now and the start of the Feast.

On the marketing side, I have continued discussions with all of our advertising partners for the 2026 Feast. This year, we have reduced our spending on traditional television and radio advertising overall while refining where those dollars are directed. We will once again be partnering with Comcast for television advertising promoting the Feast of the Hunters' Moon in the Indianapolis market. With the decision to step away from television advertising in the Chicago market this year, we are instead increasing our investment and focus in Indianapolis where we believe we can maximize visibility and audience engagement more effectively.

Outside of Feast operations, I have also been working closely with Claire on the transition of both the TCHA and Feast websites to Hustlefish. At the time of this report's submission, Hustlefish is able to immediately begin transferring our domain hosting services away from Wintek, and we are working through that transition process now.

I have also continued coordination with United State of Indiana regarding official 2026 Feast merchandise. The primary T-shirt design and this year's commemorative button artwork have both been finalized. In addition, I recently met with Trey, Diana,

and Adam to begin development of this year's mug design. We have finalized the artwork concept and are now moving into preparation of the physical print materials Diana will use to create the more than 150 commemorative mugs planned for production this year.

PROGRAMS REPORT - May 2026

Programing is rolling along, we have heard nothing but positive feedback on our members only courthouse tours. Last night we had a full house at the History Center for Whitney Walton's presentation on Emilie Koenig's Immigrant perspective on 1850's Lafayette, and it was a great one! We are now on to a couple of History on Tour Trailer run outs and the May 30th Indiana Veterans Home Cemetery Tours!

I continue to work through some Quarter 3 and Quarter 4 initiatives, with a lot of focus on applying for a grant to cover the educational program expenses for the Traveling Trunk Program, Fall 2026 Programing, and the Home School Academic Programs. Now that the academic year is winding down, I will be working with my Purdue contact to get some new things rolling for 3d Scanning and 3d printing of artifacts to use in educational programs. This was an idea I brought-in with me and hopefully can lead to a lot of cool avenues in the future.

Feast applications are coming in more frequently now, and I continue to gain my sea legs around everything that is the Feast!
