Artifact show and tell and excavation progress report from the 2025 Field Season. This program is open to the public, and free. Talk to Archeology students, anthropologists, and see the newest findings from their 2025 Field School.

The field school is co-directed by Dr. Michael Strezewski (University of Southern Indiana, World Languages and Cultures) and Dr. H. Kory Cooper (Purdue University, Department of Anthropology) and conducted through the University of Southern Indiana. ANTH 397: Archeology Field School provides students with hands-on training in archaeological fieldwork important for careers in Cultural Resources Management.

The Ouiatenon Preserve, A Roy Whistler Foundation Project is the site of the fur trade post of Fort Ouiatenon (1717-1791) and numerous other historic and Indigenous sites. The property is co-owned and operated by the TCHA and the Archaeological Conservancy and managed by the Ouiatenon Preserve Inc.
