KATHERINE KENNEDY COOPER COLLECTION

INTRODUCTION

Katherine Kennedy was born in 1894, the daughter of Michael and Mary Kennedy of Lafayette. Ca. 1910 she performed with the Otis Oliver Stock Company, a touring vaudeville troupe which gave performances at the Family Theater in Lafayette.

During WWI she served as an Overseas Entertainer in Europe, ca. 1919. Following the war she worked as stage director for the Purdue Harlequin Club's theatrical productions, ca. 1921-26. She was also employed by the Dennison Paper Company promoting its arts and crafts department.

In 1927 Katherine Kennedy married Waller Carlisle Cooper of Henderson, Kentucky; the marriage took place at St. Mary's Rectory in Lafayette.

The papers in the collection dating from ca. 1930 to 1981 (she died in 1981) refer to her life and activities in Henderson, Kentucky.

The collection includes letters written from Europe during WWI, and also items re the Purdue Harlequin Club. Included are two letters written by George Ade to Kennedy re request for letter of introduction.
