AMERICAN RED CROSS CANTEEN SERVICE COLLECTION

INTRODUCTION

In the summer of 1918, the national field agent for the American Red Cross came to Lafayette to establish the Red Cross Canteen Service. The local canteen service to troops had previously been performed by the American War Mothers of Lafayette, working under many restrictions and limited funds; they had no information as to troop trains and were not permitted to serve food. In August 1918 the War Mothers voted to undertake this service for the Red Cross, in addition to continuing their other war efforts. Mrs. Charles W. Bone, formerly chairman of the American War Mothers Canteen Committee, became commandant for the Red Cross Canteen Service. The ARC Canteen Service met trains carrying soldiers, offering "fruits, cakes, candies, souvenir post cards of Purdue University and Lafayette, cigarettes, ice cream, coffee, doughnuts, etc." in addition to words of appreciation.

The collection contains a scrapbook with newsclippings, local postcard scenes, telegrams re troop transports, and also some correspondence, financial records, insignia worn on uniforms of workers, and miscellaneous booklets mostly from the national American Red Cross. Also included in the collection are several ribbons worn at Daughters of the American Revolution state and national conferences, 1919, 1920, probably by Mrs. Charles W. Bone, DAR Lafayette Chapter regent, ca. 1919. The local DAR chapter contributed work toward the Red Cross and other relief agencies during the war.
